Board of Directors Meeting Summary

June 25, 2026 | 7:04 PM – 9:30 PM

June 25 board meeting started at 7 o'clock led by the pledge by Captain Wilson

Motion made to approve the agenda after discussion regarding section 8 under new business which was tabled motion passed.

Review of the April and May minutes both were discussed. Several changes made mainly grammatical and punctuational errors corrected in motion passed.

Phil Ackler then proceeded to give his farewell speech to the community commending all of the volunteer board members currently and board members in the past that have served to improve our community. Phil also announced he will be applying for the BOA to continue support of Lake Royale. Phil has been an intricate part of the POA for the past 4 1/2 years as he has served both as the president and as the treasurer of the board, Phil will definitely be an asset to the Board of Adjustments, and he will be greatly missed for our community on the Board of Directors.

PRESIDENT REMARKS

Steve advised the community that Mad Flavors will be doing a soft opening on July 1 and they are still waiting for a small part of the suppression system, but the Mad Flavors will be hosting the soft opening, and he will be moving forward to his full menu on the Fourth of July.

Thank you to both Mad Flavors and Augustus Grill as they have both donated meals to the Police camp starting next week.

Steve has created an ad hoc committee to help the police department led by Karen Caprio. The ad hoc committee's main goals will be to go through equipment needs for the police department safety features and administrative assistance. Ad hoc committee will have nothing to do with law changes or demand. Karen briefly spoke to the community about what the committee is doing most of the committee has got police experience in different phases of law.

Steve also created an ad hoc committee for the search of a management team. This ad hoc committee will be led by Pat Murphy, which will include Missy Atkins, Carlos Bermudez, Elaine, Sammon, Gina Louise and Constance Covillian.

The board of directors has worked out to deal with FSR. They will be on a month-to-month basis. They will still be interviewed to continue to serve Lake Royale. Continued discussion on how to work out issues they've had for the past several years. Steve stated that the reason for this was the board wanted to make sure that we searched for many companies that might be able to service the lake. The current board would do a lot of this legwork which would help the new elected Board of Director members to be able to review and add their comments and help with New on boarding.

Steve also clarified that the rumor that he was applying for the GM or had ever been offered it was just exactly what it was a rumor. Once again, encouraging people to reach out to the Board of Directors and stop listening to gossip.

FINANCIAL UPDATE

The treasurer's report is now going to be added, and to the newspaper called the treasurers' corner. Located on page 11 in the July issue.

Collection results we've reduced by 253 properties that have paid in full run payment plans overall a 6% reduction. The board president has gone in person to represent the community in small claims court and has been awarded four judgments, of which two of those people have paid in full and the other two payment plans have been issued in. Two people cannot be found. Steve stated that he had to prove to the court systems with no contracts being signed by residents of how they could give these judgments. With the assistance of Cheryl and Pat we were able to produce exhibits to the courtroom to prove that every closing has POA and HOA fee provisions, which has to be signed by both the buyer and the seller. On top of your documents, the only time this case would not be applied is if there are quick claim deeds that are issued that go between individuals with no attorneys involved. In addition, there is going to be an added waiver form attached as part of the welcome package provided to every community member that will have to be signed. They will receive a copy, and the office will keep a copy that they have read the documents and understand their legal obligations to pay dues at Lake Royale.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Committee reports were reviewed. A motion was made to accept all committee reports reviewed and passed.

LAKE ROYALE POLICE DEPARTMENT UPDATE

Captain Wilson gave a police report that things At The Lake were going smoothly. He had also stated that the majority of any incidents that are over at the river are usually domestic which is on a very limited case basis. He also stated the Police camp is going well that they are preparation for several young people to be involved and needs as many volunteers as possible to assist in the program.

MAINTENANCE DEPARTMENT UPDATE

Lance Carlson then gave a report of the Maintenance about the paving at the Shaman Road repairs were done as well as the culvert pipe replacements along Shawnee the board had approved the pavement program in close session due to the time constraints to get these roads repaired. The head wall that would be housing the boats for the dredging program was then presented. With five companies putting in bids the board voted on Harry Lee landscaping at \$204,500 to be awarded the bid pass unanimously.

SPECTRUM CONTRACT UPDATE

Amy Kingrea gave a manager report that the office staff has been diligently working to collect and get Verkada cards out to all of the residence. She also cleared up that the spectrum amount of money was received \$267,000 on which FSR got \$85,000 payment because they have a service agreement with spectrum, but the Lake did receive \$267,000 and this is to just be able to carry a sign at the front office that states that spectrum services Lake Royale.

VERKADA UPDATE

Cheryl presented the bid matrix on getting Verkada cameras on the lakeside. This is 13 cameras that would be installed. These will benefit the police department because they will be able to view any break-ins rate from their car. The system is so updated that it can actually type in a red sweatshirt, and it will pull up all activity at that site that a red sweatshirt was at. The bid was awarded to DSI securities for \$59,191. Discussion was then had about the River it was discussed that the old cameras that we are removing from the lakeside will then be installed over at the river in several areas that the police would monitor and then eventually the Verkada system would be brought over to The River as well. There was a motion made that we would check on a price from DSI of how much a Verkada camera at the front entrance at The River gate would cost. It was passed not to exceed \$2500.

The Verkada system was discussed in length about clubhouse. Clubhouse will be open during any main events for use. It will not be opened on a daily basis for traffic, the board in multiple discussions, agreed that a Verkada card is needed for individuals to be able to use the bathrooms. The discussion basically ended with we paid a lot of money for security of the lake, and this is one of the ways that ensures that the Lake will get their dues paid and everybody is treated equally by meeting their obligations.

RFID LANE GATE

The RFID Lane gate was mentioned as many people have run into the gate. People will now get fined for damage to the gate. The board had a serious discussion of how long someone would be held liable if they hit the gate if it didn't break immediately and how long that we could hold them responsible if it broke days later, the board will be reviewing with the attorney with our legal obligation is for both finding and accusing residence for the damage

Motion was made for the replacement of one of the gatehouse Gates. The board is also passed the replacement of that gate and moving the old gate arm over to the gatehouse side.

ARTICLE 7 SECTION 2 IN THE RULES AND REGULATIONS

A motion was made by Steve for the removal of article 7 section 2 in the Rules and Regulations. The motion was to strike article 7 section 2 pertaining to the requirement that all recreational vehicles be removed within 24 hours from the Rules and Regulations entirely. There was a brief discussion Jason Rogers of the building committee had stated of the community that it had been discussed amongst the building committee and for the majority they agreed that the rule was not worth keeping on record. A vote was taken and it was unanimous to remove it.

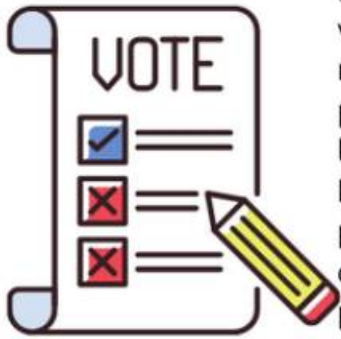

If you're looking for a fun way to move your body, clear your mind, and connect with neighbors, the new Lake Royale Dance Club may be just what you need. As someone who is passionate about self-care, overall health, coaching, and educating others, I've discovered that line dancing beautifully brings all these together.

Music has always been one of my greatest loves, and it's what first drew me onto the dance floor about a year and a half ago. I'll be honest: there were moments early on when I wanted to quit. The steps felt confusing, the patterns seemed endless, and I wondered if I'd ever "get it." But eight months into my journey, something surprising happened—I became interested not just in dancing, but in teaching line dance.

I was fortunate to learn from an amazing instructor, Sue Jennings, founder of Carolina Crew, who has been teaching all around the Triangle area for over 20 years. I've always believed that if you want to be good at something, you should learn from one of the best, and Sue is exactly that. Her patience, skill, and love for "the dance" have inspired me in countless ways.

What I've come to appreciate most is that line dancing is a "happy sport" that attracts happy people. There is nothing that makes me smile more than watching someone who struggled as much as I did in the beginning finally start to connect the steps and feel the music. Line dancing is progressive: it builds one step at a time, one sequence at a time, guided by step sheets that help dancers grow their skills gradually. That sense of progress is incredibly rewarding, both physically and mentally.

Beyond the fun, line dancing supports self-care and overall wellness. It offers gentle cardiovascular exercise, improves balance and coordination, and gives your brain a great workout as you learn and remember new patterns. Just as important, it creates a social space where people can laugh, encourage one another, and take a break from daily stress.

We're fortunate to have our beautiful clubhouse as the home for the Lake Royale Dance Club. It's a lovely venue that adds to the enjoyment of every class. I've lived here since March 2020, and one of the main reasons I stay is the community itself—the warmth, friendliness, and willingness of neighbors to show up for one another. The dance club is simply another expression of that spirit.

If you're curious, even a little bit, I encourage you to give line dancing a try. You don't need any experience, special partner, or fancy gear, just a willingness to move, learn, and have fun. 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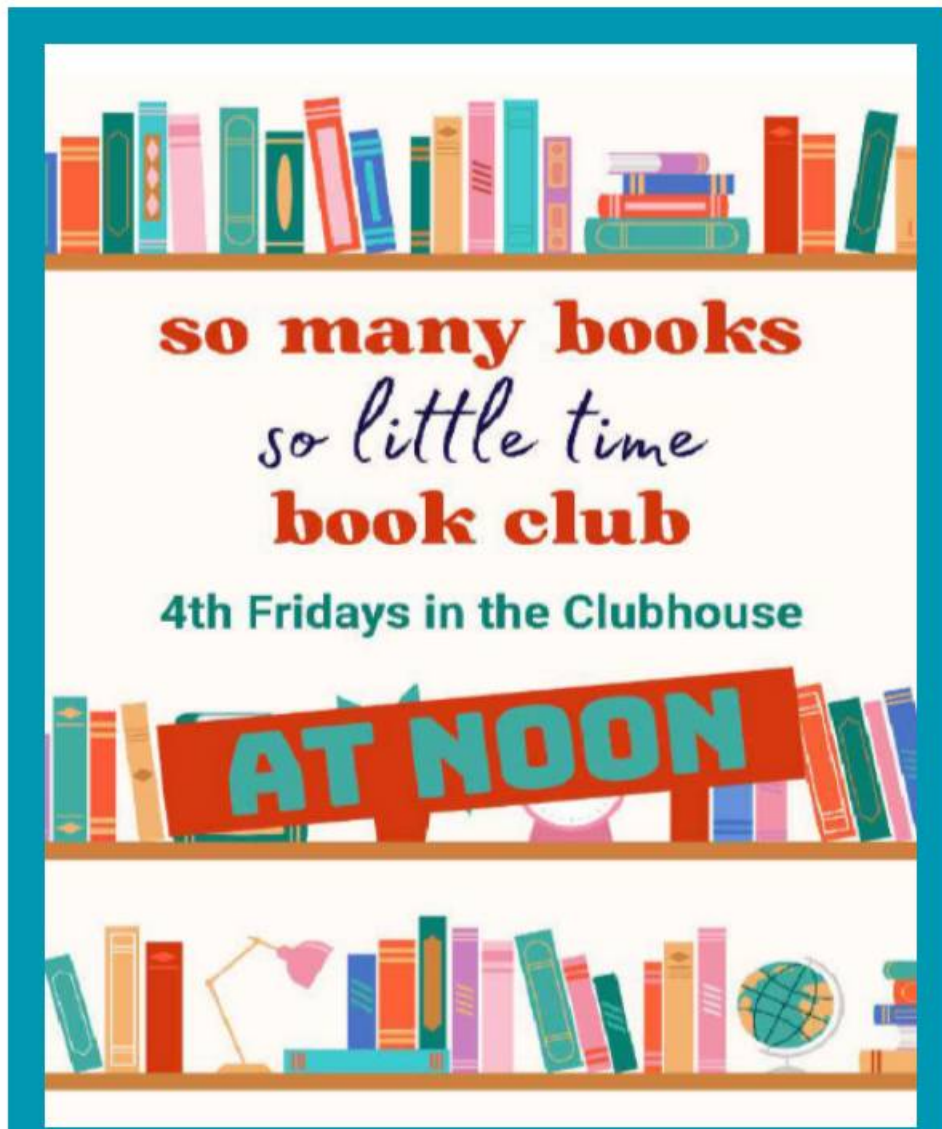

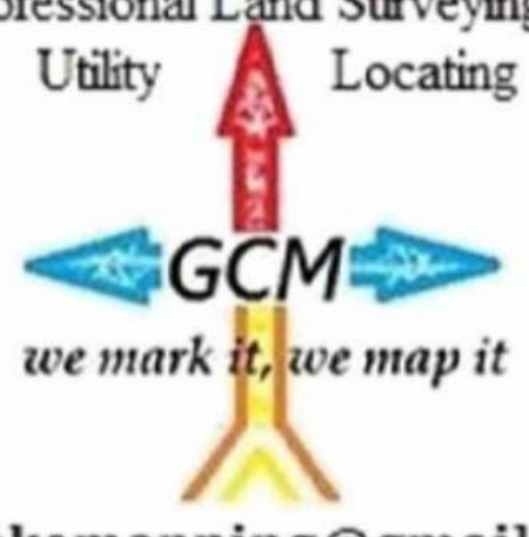

COMPLIANCE Corner

Dear Residents,

With our dry spring, we have not had too many issues with runoff and erosion. As a reminder, it is imperative to be diligent in keeping your culvert pipe and ditch line clear and unobstructed.

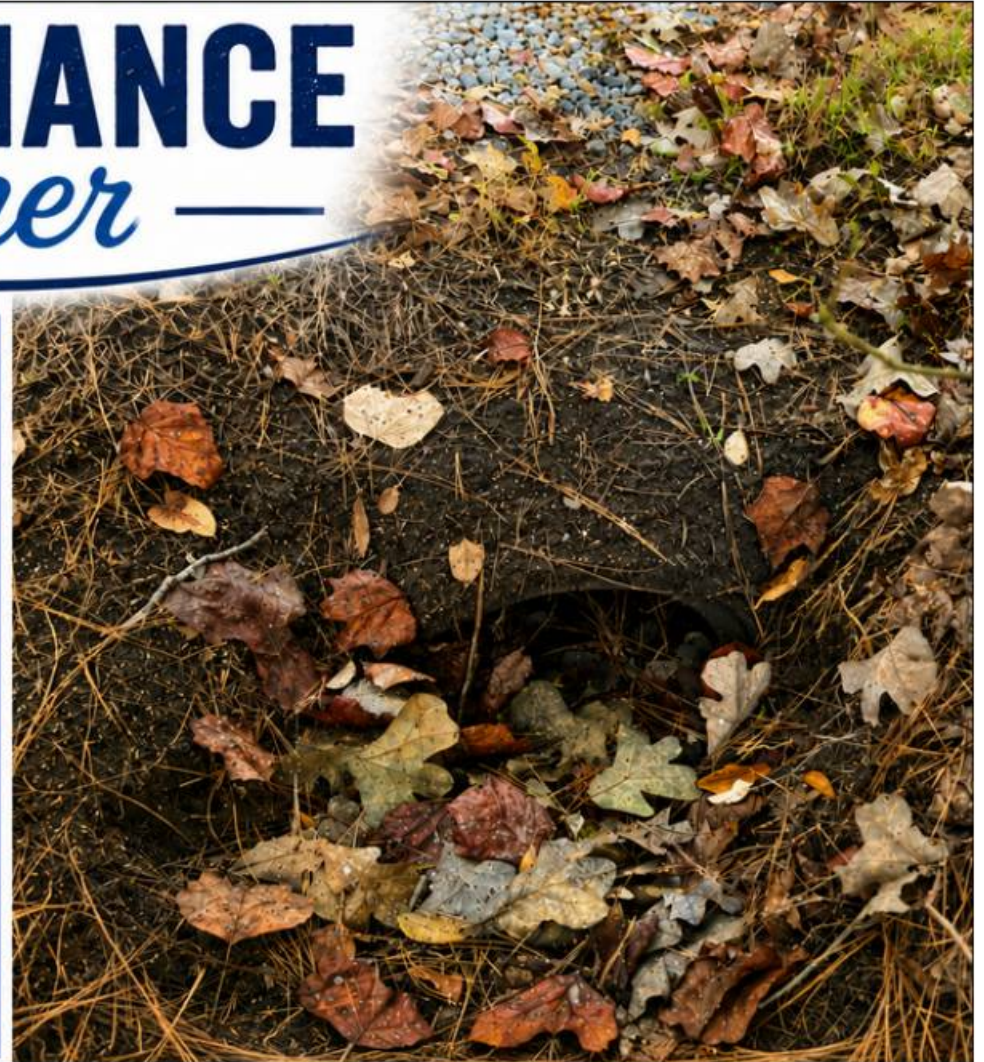
Our maintenance team has been working hard on major improvements throughout the community. As many of you may have noticed, new crossover pipes are being installed underneath the roadways. During this work, the team has identified several driveway culverts that are clogged with debris and sediment.

As part of our compliance process, we are notifying property owners of compromised culverts ahead of the maintenance schedule. Please be proactive in identifying the current condition of your culvert and take the necessary steps to keep it clear and properly maintained.

As indicated in our Governing Documents, Section 2.8, the maintenance of the shared easement, including culvert pipes, is the responsibility of the property owner.

I would like to thank those residents who currently keep their culverts clean and well maintained. Your efforts have a direct impact on managing rainwater runoff and, most importantly, helping to keep our lake as beautiful as it can be.

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How Far is “Yonder Shore”?

POLC meetings are held on the second Wednesday of each month, at the Clubhouse, 7pm. All are welcome!

One of the best ways boaters can help protect our lake is by keeping a safe distance from the shoreline whenever operating at a speed that creates a wake. But that raises an important question:

Just how far away is the shore?

The attached maps of the northern and southern portions of the lake provide approximate distances from the shoreline to the **middle of the navigable waterway** at various locations around the lake.

A Real-World Example

Imagine you're boating through the relatively narrow section of the lake just north of Rocketship Playground. If your boat is positioned exactly halfway between the two shorelines, you're only about **90 feet from each shore**.

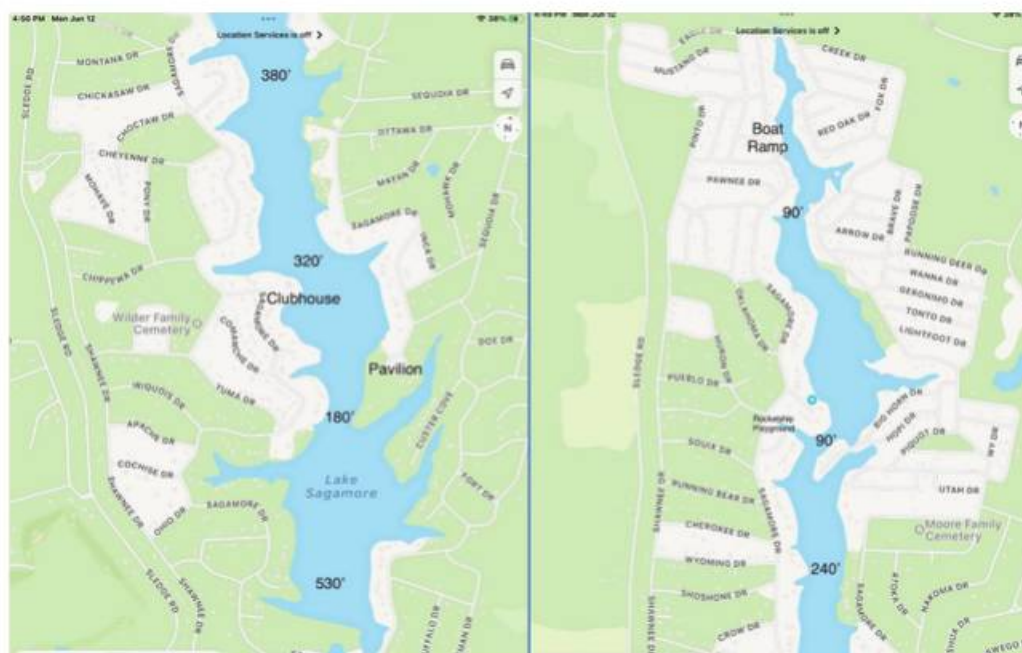
Now consider that many docks extend approximately **10 feet into the water**. Suddenly, your distance from those dock structures shrinks to roughly **80 feet**.

If you're also maintaining a safe separation from an oncoming or passing boat, your distance to a nearby dock may decrease even further—to as little as **40 to 50 feet**.

When viewed from the water, the shoreline can seem much farther away than it actually is. The maps help illustrate just how quickly available space narrows in many areas of the lake.

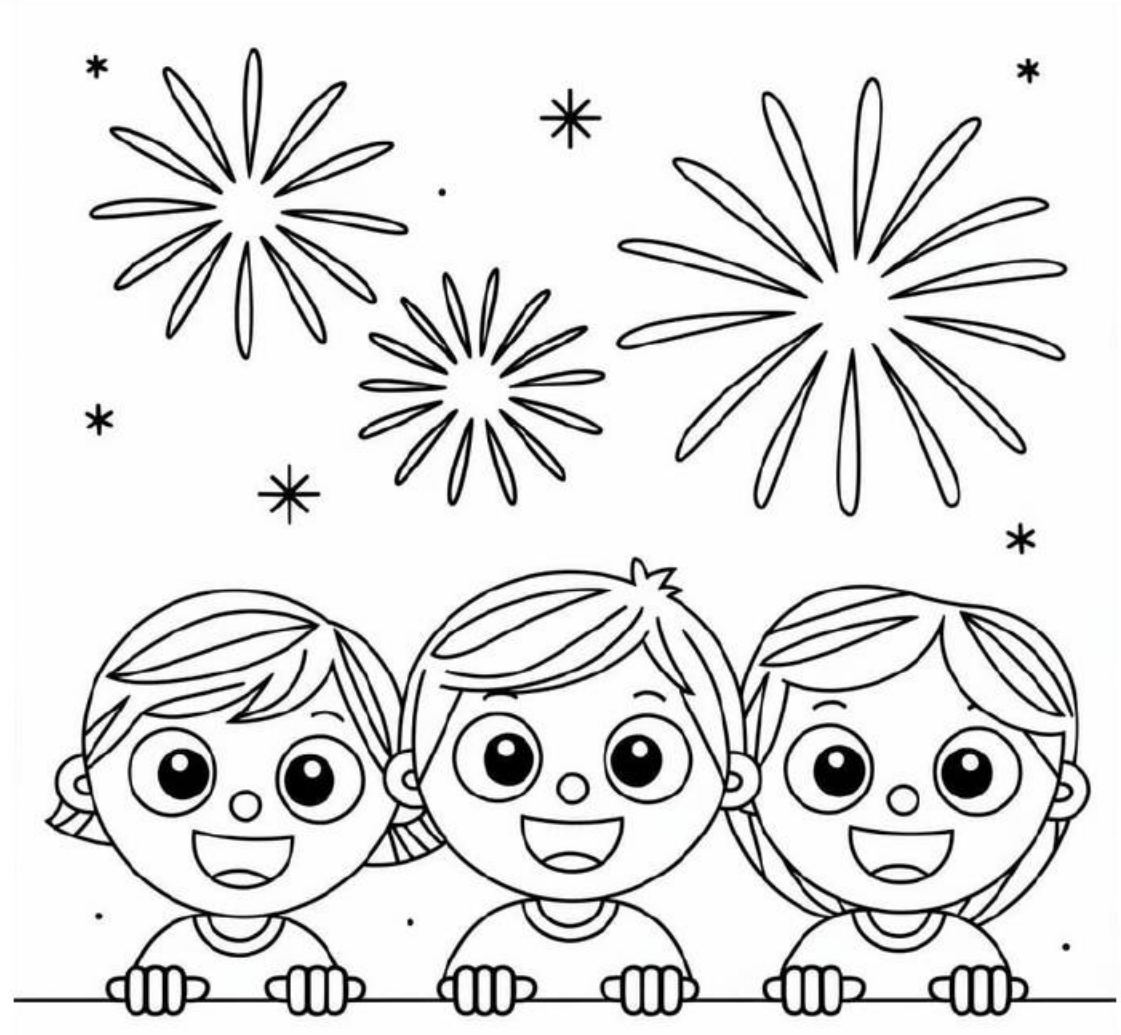
Using the Maps

The distances shown represent **approximate midpoint measurements** between opposing shorelines. They are intended to give boaters a better sense of how close they may be to docks, property owners, swimmers, anglers, and other lake users when traveling through different sections of the lake.

Monthly Safety Tips from Lake Royale CERT:

It is important to plan ahead to enjoy a safe Fourth of July Holiday. We at the lake are no exception!



Hazards commonly associated with this holiday are extreme heat, fires, injuries due to fireworks and outdoor cooking and boating injuries. It is important to take a moment and review safety and preparedness plans to ensure your celebrations are a fun occasion for all.

Here are some simple safety tips:

- If you have a large gathering (or attending LR activities) have a place to meet up if you get separated from your family. Share with your family members to report to Police, CERT members or EMS if lost.
- Leave pyrotechnics to professionals
- Enjoy outdoor celebrations and cookouts, but remember to keep children and pets at 3 feet from grills and campfires
- Monitor weather
- Drink plenty of water even if not thirsty – remember this for children and pets!
- Do not leave children or pets unattended or in a vehicle



If you are boating – remember all drivers should have completed boaters' safety course

- Do not overload your boat and ensure you have sunscreen, and basic first aid and fire extinguisher on board
- Have an observer be engaged in looking for anchored boats, moving boats, swimmers, paddlers and tubers in the water and approach carefully.
- Check your running and anchor lights prior to the sun setting and exercise caution when navigating in the dark.
- Do NOT ignite fireworks or sparklers from your boat
- Wear Bright clothing.
- Alcohol can increase your boating risks – Stay Safe

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FLAG DAY AND FLAG ETIQUETTE

On June 14th in 1777, the Second Continental Congress adopted the design for its first national flag.

This day was not recognized as a holiday until 1885, when a Wisconsin teacher taught his students to celebrate the Flag's birthday.

Our flag was first carried into battle on September 11, 1777 in the Battle of the Brandywine. The American flag was first saluted by foreign naval vessels on February 14, 1778, when the Ranger, under the command of Captain Paul Jones arrived in a French port. The flag first flew over a foreign territory in early 1778 at Nassau, Bahama Islands, where Americans captured a British Fort.

The first claim of the adoption of Flag Day was in Hartford, CT during the summer of 1861. In the late 1800s, schools all over the United States held Flag Day programs to contribute to the Americanization of immigrant children.

In 1885, B.J. Cigrand, a school teacher from Fredonia, WI mobilized his students to celebrate Flag Day on June 14th. He campaigned to establish a national flag holiday when he became editor in chief of the American Standard magazine.

The most recognized claim comes from New York. On June 14, 1889, Professor George Bolch, principal of a free kindergarten for the poor of New York City, had his school hold patriotic ceremonies to observe the anniversary of the Flag Day resolution. This attracted attention from the State Department of Education, which arranged to have the day observed in all public schools thereafter.

In Philadelphia in 1893, the Society of Colonial Dames succeeded in getting a resolution passed to have the flag displayed on all of the city's public buildings. Elizabeth Duane Gillespie, a direct descendant of Benjamin Franklin and president of the Colonial Dames of Pennsylvania, that same year tried to get the city to call June 14th Flag Day. It was not until May 7, 1937 that Pennsylvania became the first state to establish June 14th Flag Day as a legal holiday and is the only state to recognize it as a legal holiday.

On June 14, 1894, the American Flag Day Association organized the first public school celebration of Flag Day in Chicago, IL.

On May 13, 1916, President Woodrow Wilson officially announced that June 14th will forever be a national holiday to celebrate the history and importance of the United States Flag. President Harry Truman signed an Act of Congress in 1949, officially designating June 14th as National Flag Day. President Donald Trump expanded the celebration in 2017 by proclaiming Flag Day and Flag Week.

To Veterans throughout American history, the Stars and Stripes has served as a symbol of their service and as a continuing testimony that the service is worthwhile. For almost 250 years "Old Glory" has flown over our country, through strife and peace, in tragedy and triumph. Our flag is the symbol of a nation comprised of people dedicated to freedom and independence.

AMVETS Post 201 is located at Lake Royale and meets the second Monday of each month at 6:30PM at the Commons. The AMVETS will accept old flags for disposal in a proper and dignified manner. HOW TO DISPLAY YOUR FLAG

When the flag is displayed from a staff projecting from a window sill, balcony or front of a building, the union should be at the staff's peak.

When displayed either horizontally or vertically against a wall, the union should be uppermost and to the flag's on right, that is to the observer's left.

When flags of States, cities, or localities or pennants of societies are flown on the same halyard with the flag of the United States, the latter should always be at the peak.

When displayed from a staff in a church, public auditorium or convention hall, the U.S. flag should hold the position of superior prominence; in advance of the audience and in the position of honor at the speaker's or clergyman's right as he faces the audience. Any other flag displayed should be placed on the left. The U.S. flag is always on the speaker's right whether it is placed on a platform or whether it is placed at floor level.

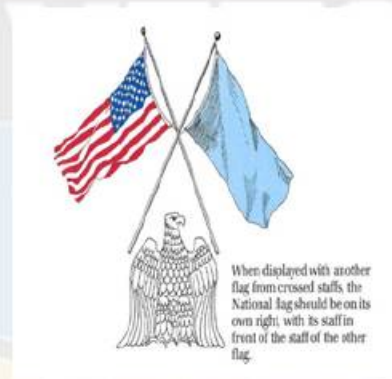
If displayed flat against the wall on a speaker's platform, the U.S. flag should be placed above and behind the speaker with the union of the flag in the upper left-hand corner as the audience faces the flag.

When displayed at half-staff, the flag is first raised to the peak and then lowered to the half-staff position. When being lowered for the day it should first be raised to the peak.

The flag when carried in a procession with another flag or flags, should be either on the marching right; that is, the flag's own right, or if there is a line of other flags, in front of the center of that line.

The wording of the Pledge of Allegiance varies slightly from the original, which was drawn up in 1892 in the office of The Youth's Companion Magazine in Boston. It was first used in the public schools in celebration of Columbus Day, October 12, 1892. The pledge received official recognition by Congress in an Act approved June 22, 1942. The phrase "under God" was added to the pledge by a Congressional Act on June 14, 1954.

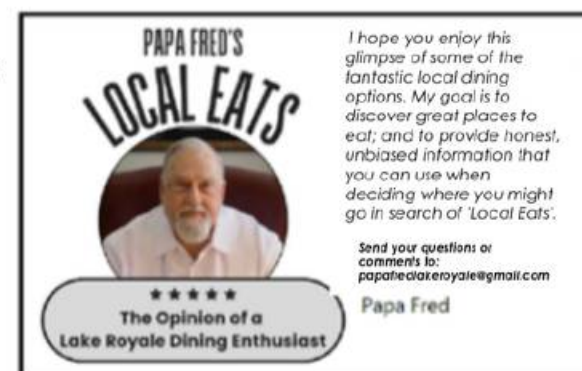




Como Dice El Dicho – Mexican & American Favorites

"Local Eats - The Opinion of a Lake Royale Dining Enthusiast"

Como Dice El Dicho (**Koh**-moh **dee**-seh ehi **dee**-choh) translates to 'as the saying goes' in English and is used to introduce timeless pieces of folk wisdom. This new Mexican-American addition to the Bunn dining scene is located in the old Sisters Cafe building; which has been totally renovated into a bright, fresh welcoming restaurant. In addition to authentic Mexican dishes, Como offers a variety of All-American selections including Burgers, Wings, Chicken, Fried Fish, Paninis and Grilled Cheese.



It is unique among local Mexican restaurants in that it also serves breakfast - a very good breakfast. Choices range from **Huevos Mexicana** (Eggs with Tomato, Onion, Jalapeño, Rice, Beans and Tortillas - \$12.99) or Huevos Con Chorizo to **Pancakes, French Toast, Grits, Country Ham and Home Fries**. The traditional **Huevos Rancheros** (3 Fried Eggs, Salsa, Beans and Tortillas - \$11.99) is not the fancied-up version found in most American restaurants; but the authentic ones you would expect to see a Vaquero enjoying in his cocina de rancho. This simple dish is surprisingly tasty. Breakfast is available from 6:00 AM - 11:00 AM.

For lunch or dinner I recommend the **Tortas** (cross between a Cubano and a Panini). The Bolillo (crusty Mexican sandwich bread) is packed with Refried Beans, Janapeño, Avocado, Cheese, Lettuce and Tomato (\$11.99). Add a plate of flavorful Rice and Beans (\$5.00) for a complete Mexican feast. The **Taco Special** (\$2.50 each Tuesday and Wednesday) is a real bargain. Choices include either Corn or Flour Tortilla - Soft or Hard - Carnitas (braised Pork) or Polo (Chicken) or Pastor (marinated Pork).

At first I wasn't sure how much I would like Como. It's so new and bright (very bright) and has not yet developed that warm, cozy feel. Now after several visits, I find that it is growing on me. The food is plain and simple - and, most of all, delicious. The atmosphere is warm and friendly, and the service comes with a genuine smile. I will definitely be back often.

Procedure:

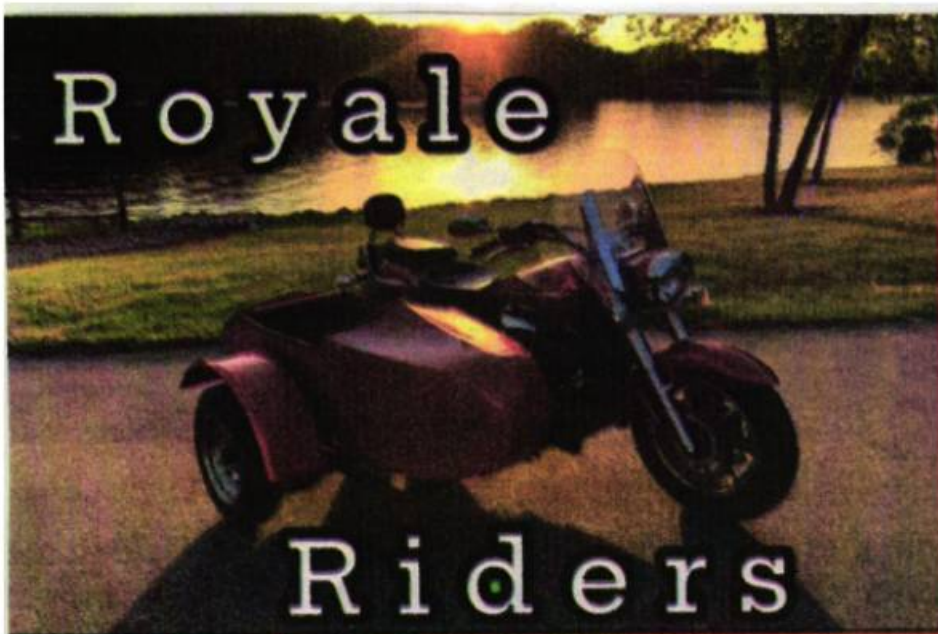
Ingredients

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GOLF COURSE PUMP REPLACEMENT

HOME OWNER COMMENTS

The meeting then moved to the residential speakers, Greg Chottiner about IT and Verkada specifically and assistance that he is willing to help with. Christine Spain then got an understanding of the spectrum contract and how much money was received and what was required of the community to receive that money, Rich Dyer spoke about collections, the dredging program and thank the Board of Directors for respecting the new upcoming boards request of waiting to change management company, Chuck Coster spoke of the Golf Course and repairs that are being done there. The investment At the Lake would be made and a clearer understanding of the process. Virgil Wright also spoke about the dredging program and the Lake Golf Course situation. Dylan Bunch spoke about multiple miscellaneous issues offering help.

The meeting adjourned at 10:15 at night.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE LRPOA BY-LAWS

Article II, Section 8. Paragraph G. Sub-paragraph 1

REASON FOR CHANGE: This recommended amendment to the LRPOA By-Laws shall establish a standard process for amending the Association's Rules & Regulations. This process shall ensure the widest possible dissemination of information about any proposed amendment, prior to its being adopted, and shall allow property owners an opportunity to review the proposed amendment and provide their input prior to the Board's vote on the amendment. It shall also allow ample time for any members affected by the amended Rules & Regulations to explore and make any adjustments needed to comply with the change.

PORTION OF THE BY-LAWS TO BE AMENDED: Article II, Section 8, Paragraph G, Sub- paragraph 1.

AS READS: Article II, Section 8. Paragraph G. Sub-paragraph 1

Sub-paragraph 1, if approved, will be an addition to the By-Laws, so there is no "as reads" verbiage.

SHALL READ: Article II, Section 8. Paragraph G. Sub-paragraph 1

1) Any LRPOA member in good standing may request an amendment to the Rules & Regulations of the Association. Any request for an amendment, whether being requested by an individual, group, Committee or Board, shall be presented to the By-Laws and Covenants Committee (BLCC) in writing and must contain: a) The reason or purpose for the requested amendment; b) the specific section of the Rules & Regulations to be amended; and c) the proposed language of the amendment as it is desired by the member(s) submitting the request. All requests for amendments to the Rules & Regulations shall follow the process outlined below.

a. The requested amendment shall be submitted to the BLCC for review. The request may be submitted to the Chairman, Vice-Chairman or Secretary of the BLCC, or to the General Manager who shall forward the request to the chairman of the BLCC

- b. The BLCC, at its next regularly scheduled meeting, shall begin a review of the proposed amendment, ensuring that:
- 1.) There is no conflict with any other provision of the Rules & Regulations, By-Laws or Covenants;
 - 2) the proposed amendment is not in conflict with any federal or state laws or any county ordinances;
 - 3) the language in the proposed amendment is grammatically correct, easily understood and accurately conveys the intent of the amendment; and
 - 4) the proposed amendment is properly formatted for inclusion in the Rules & Regulations.
- c. Upon completion of the review process, the BLCC shall forward the proposed amendment to the Secretary of the Association's Board of Directors and the General Manager.
- d. The Board of Directors shall, at its next regularly-scheduled open meeting after receiving the proposed amendment from the BLCC:
- 1) conduct the first of three required readings of the proposed amendment;
 - 2) direct that the proposed amendment be published in the next edition of The Royale Reporter; and
 - 3) direct the General Manager to send an email to all Association members on the Association's email list, advising them of the proposed amendment and inviting property owners' comments on the proposed amendment.
- e. The Board of Directors shall, at its second regularly-scheduled open meeting after receiving the proposed amendment from the BLCC:
- 1) conduct the second required reading of the proposed amendment: and
 - 2) invite property owners' comments on the proposed amendment.
- f. The Board of Directors shall, at its third regularly-scheduled open meeting after receiving the proposed amendment from the BLCC:
- 1) conduct the third required reading of the proposed amendment: and
 - 2) invite property owners' comments prior to bringing the proposed amendment to a vote by the Board members.
- g. If the Board of Directors approves the amendment, it shall become effective 30 days after approval of the minutes of the Board meeting at which the amendment was approved.
- h. After the aforementioned minutes have been approved, the Association's General Manager shall:
- 1) update the amended Rules & Regulations;
 - 2) post the amendment on the Association's website; and
 - 3) generate an email broadcast to all Association members on the Association's membership email list, advising them of the effective date of the amendment.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE LRPOA BY-LAWS

Article II, Section 9

REASON FOR CHANGE: Article 1, Section 1.2 (1) (e) of the Rules & Regulations states that property owners have the Right to "Prudent expenditure of fees and other assessments." Article 1, Section 1.2 (4), at subsections (b), (e),(h), and (j) states that community leaders have the responsibility to exercise sound business judgment and follow established management practices; establish committees or use other methods to obtain input from owners and non-owner residents; encourage input from property owners on issues affecting them personally and the community as a whole; and conduct business in a transparent manner when feasible and appropriate.

Though each of the above items is clearly stated in the Rules & Regulations, there is no established process that the Board of Directors is required to follow to ensure compliance. This is especially true as it relates to the expenditure of Association funds. This proposed amendment is needed to ensure transparency in all non-emergency discretionary expenditures of Association funds; provide a mechanism by which property owners are made aware of such proposed expenditure of Association funds; ensure that property owners have ample opportunity to review the proposed expenditure; and ensure that property owners may provide input on the proposed expenditure before the proposed expenditure may be brought up for a vote by the Board.

PORTION OF THE BY-LAWS TO BE AMENDED: Article II, Section 9

AS READS: Article II, Section 9, if approved, will be an addition to the By-Laws, so there is no "as reads" verbiage.

SHALL READ: Article II, Section 9 Non-Emergency Discretionary Expenditures - Property Owner Notice and Input
For the purpose of construing this section, "emergency" shall be defined, as set forth in North Carolina law, as a situation or imminent threat of widespread or severe damage, injury or loss of life or property, resulting from a natural or man-made cause. A discretionary expenditure shall be defined as any expenditure of the Association's funds requiring Board approval.

Prior to bringing any proposed non-emergency discretionary expenditure of Association funds to a vote, the Board of Directors shall:

- A. Include details of the proposed expenditure in the circulated and posted agenda for the regularly-scheduled Board meeting at which the proposed expenditure will first be discussed.
- B. During the "New Business" portion of that Board of Directors' open meeting, provide the Association's property owners with details of the proposed expenditure, including all justifications for it, the total projected cost and the source(s) in the budget from which the funds shall come, prior to tabling the proposal to be considered at a subsequent meeting.
- C. Direct that details of the proposed expenditure be fully published in the next edition of The Royale Reporter.
- D. Direct the General Manager to send an email to all Association members on the Association's email list, advising them of the details of the proposed expenditure and inviting property owners' comments on the proposed expenditure, noting that it may be approved as soon as the next open Board meeting.
- E. At the next regularly-scheduled Board of Director's open meeting, bring the proposed expenditure up for discussion and a vote.
